ORDINANCE NO. 3 OF 2001

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING THE RATE OF COMPENSATION FOR TOWNSHIP SUPERVISORS

WHEREAS, the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania by enacting Act 60 of 1995, revised the Second Class Township Code setting forth new guidelines and limitations for the compensation of Supervisors of Townships of the second class; and

WHEREAS, Section 606 of said act provides that Supervisors of Townships having a population of less than 5,000 people may be compensated in an amount not to exceed \$1,875 per year; and

WHEREAS, said act provides that the population of the Township shall be determined by the latest available official census figures; and

WHEREAS, the Constitution of Pennsylvania prohibits an elected official's compensation from being changed during the current term of office; and

WHEREAS, the most recent census figures for Fannett Township indicate a population of less than 5,000 for the Township; and

WHEREAS, the General Assembly by said act authorizes the Board of Supervisors of the various Townships of the second class to determine the compensation of Supervisors subject to the limitations set forth in the act; and

WHEREAS, it is the intention of the Board of Supervisors of Fannett Township to set compensation for Supervisors within the limitations of said act.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED AND ORDAINED, and it is enacted and ordained by the Board of Supervisors of this Township as follows:

1. Each Supervisor of Fannett Township elected or appointed to office after the adoption of this ordinance, shall receive compensation as a supervisor in the annual amount of \$1,875.00.

- 2. Such compensation shall be paid in monthly installments.
- 3. This ordinance shall take effect five days after enactment thereof.
